


#### **Ridership Impacts – Avg. Daily Boardings (Metro Bus)**


### **Ridership Impacts – Change by Period of Day**


Change in Boardings by Period - 2019 to 2020





#### **Ridership Impacts – Change by Service Type**





## **Ridership Impacts - Current Ridership**

- 125,000 average daily boardings in February (30% of one year ago)
- RapidRide and future RapidRide candidates have the most daily boardings
- Express routes continue to see low ridership








## **Service Impacts – What type of service is suspended?**

#### **All-day routes**

King County

- **9 routes** fully suspended
- **17 routes** partially suspended



Peak-only routes

(morning & afternoon)

- **49 routes** fully suspended
- 4 routes partially suspended



## **Service Impacts – Capacity Limits**

- Passenger Load Limits 12 per 40' bus / 18 per 60' bus
- Pass-ups


Occurring on some routes even with reduced ridership levels
 Most common in the afternoon (2-5pm)

COVID capacity limits 40' Bus 12 Riders 24% of Crowding Threshold



## **Social Equity Implications – Percent Change in Ridership**

- Largest Declines (top 10%)

   Peak-only routes
   Non-frequent routes
   Routes crossing Lake Washington
- Smallest Declines (bottom 10%)

   Frequent, all-day routes
   Routes Serving South King County
   RapidRide routes







## **Social Equity Implications – COVID Crowding Levels**

- Low-income and minority designated routes have more pass-ups
- Using supplemental service to target improvements

- Looking to begin restoring suspended service in September
- Restoration Priorities
  - Equity Routes with high opportunity scores
  - Ridership Routes serving the most people
  - Crowding Routes where crowding is (and/or is likely to be) and issue
