In the absence of a committee chairperson, Gil Cerise, PSRC, facilitated the meeting. Gil welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. and then took a roll call and confirmed the members and alternates present.

### **Approval of Meeting Summary**

The September 15, 2021 meeting summary was approved as presented.

### **Discussion: Regional Transportation Plan Outreach**

Jean Kim, PSRC, provided a brief presentation on the status of the Regional Transportation Plan/Coordinated Mobility Plan outreach which included outreach methods, goals, and current and future efforts.
