## **Regional Project Evaluation Committee Meeting Summary**

Date: Thursday, May 26, 2022 from 1:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m.

#### Location: Hybrid Meeting - PSRC Board Room – 1011 Western Ave., Seattle, 98104 Remote Participation via Zoom

#### Introductions and Review of Meeting Procedures

Kelly McGourty, PSRC, welcomed everyone at 1:00 p.m. She reviewed the meeting procedures and confirmed that the designated members were present. She reminded the committee that if it was needed, the next meeting would be Friday, May 27, 2022 from 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. to conclude the project selection recommendations.

#### Action: Project Recommendations - 2022 FHWA Regional Competition

Kelly provided an overview of the process the committee was to follow to prepare a funding recommendation to the Transportation Policy Board including a review of the meeting procedures. The committee began with a discussion of the additonal factors that will be used in the deliberations, above and beyond the scores. Consensus was reached to include geographic, agency, modal and phase balance; project completion / implementation; scalability; and unique circumstances.

The committee proceeded to discuss the projects, beginning with CMAQ submittals. Projects were reviewed for scalability, and whether or not a lower amount of funding could be accepted. The committee made a preliminary recommendation on the top four ranked CMAQ projects, with further discussion to be held after the deliberation on STP projects. The committee agreed to consider STP projects at or above the score of 60 for further discussion. Project sponsors then identified if their project was scalable, could accept a lower amount of funding, or if they wished to remain on the contingency list at the full amount. Considerations of agency and geographic balance were then discussed among the projects. To address these factors, Bothell identified their first priority for their two projects on the list, moving the second to the contingency list. The Kitsap County project accepted a lower amount of funding, and the Tacoma and SeaTac projects were moved to the contingency list to address geographic balance. In addition, the Port of Seattle project was moved to the contingency list, with a voluntary reduction in their request.

The committee then returned their discussion to the CMAQ list, and agreed to recommend the top four ranked projects, with the balance of funding recommended to the PSCAA project for a portion of the project (funding for one locomotive would remain on the contingency list). The committee then recommended the contingency list projects in rank order by score. The approved final recommendation is attached.
