


Annual Population Forecast: 2010 to 2050

Annual Components of Population Change: 2013 to 2022



We will need almost 1 million new housing units by 2050




Total Housing Unit Forecast: 2010 to 2050

Annual Housing Unit Change by Type: 2013 to 2022



The region has finally returned to 2019 job levels





The region is about 1 year behind job forecasts for 2022




Annual Job Forecast: 2010 to 2025



Not all job sectors have fully recovered





Unemployment is back to pre-pandemic levels








Working from home is still changing
