Regional Staff Committee Meeting Summary

Introductions and Announcements

Chip Vincent, Co-Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:30 am. Participants were asked to view the meeting attendance on the "chat" feature on Zoom, and phone-in participants were asked to identify themselves verbally.

Reports

Co-Chair Chip Vincent welcomed the committee members and explained that PSRC staff would provide short updates on upcoming policy and Executive Board meetings and review the status of ongoing projects in the work program.

Ben Bakkenta, Director of Regional Planning, shared that there are two open positions at PSRC – one for an Economic Development Specialist, and another for an Administrative Assistant. Interested applicants can find more information about these positions at https://www.psrc.org/about/careers. PSRC's partnership with the Department of Commerce and MRSC is continuing in the Passport to 2044 webinar series, with sessions on Planning for Critical Areas on Wednesday November 30, and the final one of 2022 on Planning for TOD and Centers on Tuesday December 13. Additional sessions on Housing and Equity and a special workshop for Elected Officials and Planning Commissioners will be held in 2023. Puget Sound Clean Air Agency will hold an online open house through November 20; this event is designed to solicit input on the Clean Air Agency's 2030 Strategic Plan. Lastly, Ben shared that the next RSC meeting on December 15 will be a hybrid meeting, with a networking lunch to follow.

Discussion: Regional Housing Strategy Monitoring

Following up on the committee's discussion of the Regional Housing Strategy monitoring program in May, this presentation reviewed monitoring work for 2022, including data and case studies looking at how the strategy is being implemented and identifying gaps and opportunities for future work. Laura Benjamin, Senior Planner, asked for committee feedback about how this data may help local plan updates and monitoring of the Regional Housing Strategy.

SUBJECT: Equity Planning Resources for Comprehensive Planning

IN BRIEF

PSRC is developing a Regional Equity Strategy to provide planning resources and best practices for local governments to support equitable outcomes. At its December meeting, the Regional Staff Committee will hear a briefing on the Equity Planning Resources component of this work.

DISCUSSION

VISION 2050 includes <u>policies and actions</u> throughout the plan to advance a more equitable region. Surveys of local planners have identified the need for additional guidance and examples of how equity could be integrated into comprehensive plan elements. Beyond VISION 2050, recent changes to the state Growth Management Act also require additional focus on inequities in housing.

As part of the Regional Equity Strategy development, PSRC staff have been working with the Equity Advisory Committee to develop resources to center equity in planning. The first phase of this work focuses on providing guidance for comprehensive plan updates due in 2024.

Next Steps

Staff will provide a full draft of the Equity Planning Resources to the Equity Advisory Committee in January for comment before finalizing.

SUBJECT: Equitable Engagement Guidance for Local Jurisdictions

IN BRIEF

Community Engagement is one of four pillars of the <u>Regional Equity Strategy</u>¹. It includes several elements, including: 1) convening and facilitating this Committee, 2) working with local organizations and 3) creating guidance and resources for engaging with communities (both for PSRC and local jurisdiction staff).

At the December meeting, PSRC staff will provide a briefing on the Equitable Engagement Guidance for local jurisdictions.

DISCUSSION

PSRC develops data, guidance, and resources to support implementation of VISION through local planning. Guidance documents developed so far are available on the <u>VISION 2050 Planning Resources</u> page.

Planners from cities and counties in the region have asked for more resources on conducting equitable engagement for their local comprehensive plan updates. PSRC staff have developed a guidance document on equitable engagement, with examples from PSRC and the region.

The Equitable Engagement Guidance document highlights four key considerations when conducting community engagement, as well as strategies for their implementation:

- Identify Impacted Communities
- Develop Engagement Strategy
- Establish Meaningful Relationships

¹ The four key component categories of PSRC's Regional Equity Strategy are A) Capacity Building, B) Data and Research, C) Community Engagement, and D) Best Practices.

Next Steps

The <u>Equitable Engagement Guidance</u> document is published on PSRCs website to assist local jurisdictions as they begin their comprehensive planning process. Staff also presented the Guidance document at a <u>Passport to 2044 Equity workshop</u> in November. PSRC staff are currently finalizing guidance and resources on engagement for internal use and will bring this work to the Committee at a future meeting.
