Allocation of Regional Priority Rankings

- WSDOT allows projects to apply for 2 or 4 years
- 8 projects (\$2.8M) were funded in 2021 for 2023-25 biennium

- 15 ABC rankings are available for 2023-25 for PSRC:
 - 5 A's
 - 5 B's
 - 5 C's
 - Unlimited D's



Regional Priority Ranking Factors

- PSRC worked with the Special Needs Transportation Committee to develop the Regional Priority Ranking Factors
- These factors are derived from PSRC's Coordinated Mobility Plan:
 - Project type (preservation vs. new/expansion)
 - Support for PSRC's Coordinated Mobility Plan
 - Uniqueness of service
 - Financial sustainability



Summary of Projects Recommended

- Number of Projects: 16 projects (5 A's, 5 B's, 5C's, and 1D)
- Total Request:
 - \$10.9M for 2023-25
 - \$8.3M for 2025-27
- Project Types:
 - Operating projects
 - Mobility management
 - Planning
- More than half of the projects are seeking funding for four years
