




Regional Housing Strategy Actions and Tools




Regional Housing Strategy Monitoring

- Provide a snapshot of key housing measures in the region, as well as longer term trends
- Help to shape and focus regional housing assistance and local work, with a focus on eliminating racial disparities in access to housing
- Following 2024 plan updates, develop a periodic review and update to the Regional Housing Strategy





Increased difficulty for prospective firsttime buyers to own a home






Access to Affordable Rentals by Race/Ethnicity – White Renter Households





Housing Development Inside Regional Growth Centers and Near Transit, 2010 - 2020




2022 Joint Housing Opinion Survey





Survey Purpose & Approach

PSRC collaborated with the Department of Commerce to hire Seattle-based research firm, PRR, to conduct a survey to assess housing needs in 12 counties across the state.



Research objectives

- Explore attitudes about Washington state's housing needs.
- Outline housing desires, needs, and priorities of the general public.
- Provide decision makers with input from a broad crosssection of the public.



Housing costs and homelessness are the top two issues throughout Washington state

77% say rents are too high75% say it costs too much to buy a home

83% say more reasonably priced housing is needed in their communities



Respondents Want More Housing Options

78% say they want more housing options for seniors, teachers, firefighters, childcare workers, and health care workers

74% prefer most new housing to be 500.000 in walkable neighborhoods

64% agree that their community needs more diverse and affordable types of housing

State projects need of 1 million more homes needed by 2044



Permanent Supportive Housing 🔵 Below 50% AMI 😑 50–100% AMI Over 100% AMI




Support for Diverse & "Middle" Housing

Communities need more diverse & affordable housing types, such as **duplexes**, **cottages**, **courtyard apartments**, townhomes and mixed developments.

66% Agree

Multi-family housing, like triplexes, should be allowed in single-family zones all standards the zone are met, such as heights, setbacks, and parking.

58% Agree





People Feel the Impacts

76% are directly impacted or know someone affected by housing costs and availability

8% have experienced threats of eviction or foreclosure

7% have experienced discrimination in housing

14% have been forced to move due to costs, eviction, or foreclosure





People Tie Housing to Community Satisfaction

80% say that more housing, if done well, is likely to make their community better



Residents Want Government to Do More

83% say government agencies should **work together** to address the need for housing

64% say government agencies should do more to provide housing not being delivered by the market
