




Growth Management Act Projections


- State Office of Financial Management releases a forecast every five years
- Forecast informs growth expectations in local comprehensive plans
- Provides high, medium, and low range
- State had last released forecast in 2017
- 2022 OFM GMA Projections published at the end of the year

Growth Targets

- First major local implementation step for VISION 2050
- Growth targets establish population and employment growth for comprehensive plans
- Counties adopted growth targets in 2021-22 based on regional forecast and 2017 state forecast



Growth Target Guidance



Recommended Process for Addressing 2022 OFM Population Projections:

- Develop targets based on PSRC regional forecast
- Ensure the county total used to develop population targets remains within the OFM range
- If the 2022 projections suggest adjusting the county control totals, coordinate through PSRC's Land Use Technical Advisory Committee

Policy-directed land use projection:

- Consistent with new growth targets & VISION 2050 Regional Growth Strategy
- Supports travel modeling for comprehensive plans, other regional studies

Housing Need Allocations

- HB 1220 (2021) requires local comprehensive plans address countywide housing need by income bands
- Continued work in each county to develop housing targets and allocate countywide housing need



Growth Target Development

- Compared to VISION 2040, much closer alignment between the Regional Growth Strategy and countywide growth targets
- New and expanded role for Core Cities and High Capacity Transit Communities
- Lingering challenges with higher growth planned for Cities & Towns and Urban Unincorporated
- Implementation challenge to reduce rate of rural growth, support significant growth in Metro and Core cities, particularly outside of King County
