Laying it on the Line

- 1. I can define systemic racism.
- 2. Hiring and promotion decisions should be based solely on merit.
- 3. I believe we can end racial inequity.



- 1) Think of a number between 1 and 10
- 2) Multiply that number times 9
- 3) If it is a two-digit number add them together (for example 32 would be 3+2=5)
 4) Subtract 5
- 5) Convert to a letter (a is 1, b is 2, etc.)


Creating Change

Race explicit, but not exclusive always bring an "intersectional" analysis





Racial equity

Racial equity is when 1) **race no longer is a determinant of life outcomes** and 2) in addressing racial inequity directly, we improve outcomes for everyone, including White people

Racial equity is both **our process** <u>and</u> **the outcome we seek to achieve**. It is an *inclusive* approach to transform structures towards access, justice, self-determination, redistribution, and sharing of power and resources.






