

Freight Advisory Committee Meeting Summary

Date: June 14, 2023 - 9:30a.m. - 11:00a.m.

Location: Remote – Online Meeting Only (Zoom Meeting)

Welcome and Introductions

Geri Poor, Chair, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. Roll call was completed to confirm the members and alternates present.

Action: Approval of Meeting Summary

The April 12, 2022, meeting summary was approved as presented.

Discussion: FAC Operating Procedures and Membership

Jennifer Barnes, PSRC, provided a briefing on the FAC's current operating procedures and membership structure, which is due for triennial review. The current membership is structured around industrial subareas. Paul Inghram, PSRC Director of Growth Planning, discussed the industrial land analysis which is moving away from industrial subareas and shifting focus to manufacturing/industrial centers (MICs). The industrial lands analysis is considering industrial development outside of MICs.

The committee began discussion of considerations to determine if the current structure should be continued or a new structure adopted. PSRC staff will provide comparison of the industrial subareas versus MICs at a future meeting, for the committee to review and continue discussion.

Discussion: Roundtable Discussion – Freight Components of Comprehensive Plans

The committee participated in a roundtable discussion of their agencies' strategies and considerations for incorporating freight into the transportation element of their comprehensive plans, which are due for update in 2024. Discussion included the relationship of ports' long-range planning with comprehensive planning for the jurisdiction(s) in which they are located, and members shared freight considerations in their respective jurisdictions.

There was question about the role of regional modeling as it related to freight, and it was clarified that the PSRC has developed different models for different purposes and does not explicitly forecast freight trucks. Someone from PSRC's Data department will

be invited to a future meeting to discuss PSRC's models and the type of information that is available to support freight analysis. There is also support for a more detailed discussion about issues and strategies to address conflicts between trucks and other modes of travel, particularly pedestrians and bicyclists.
