

- ✓ We conduct more than 130 censuses, surveys and estimates each year, including
 - ✓ **The Decennial Census** – the once-a-decade population and housing count of all 50 states and U.S. territories
 - ✓ **The American Community Survey** – the ongoing, annual survey of the social, economic, housing, and demographic characteristics of the nation's population
 - ✓ **The Economic Census** – the official five-year measure of American businesses

Our mission is to serve as the nation's leading provider of quality data about its people and economy.



Comparison Profiles – Comparison of ACS estimates over time in the same layout as the Data Profiles

Selected Population Profiles (S0201) – Broad ACS statistics for population subgroups by race, ethnicity, ancestry, tribal affiliation, and place of birth

Detailed Tables (B or C) – Most detailed estimates on all topics for all geographies

Subject Tables (S) – A span of information on particular ACS subject presented in the format of both estimates and percentages

Ranking Tables (R) – State rankings across approximately 90 key variables


