Transit Integration Report



- PSRC started annual report in 2014 in response to Executive Board request
- Legislature added requirement in 2015: [RCW 35.58.2796\(2\(a\)\)](#)
- In light of other priorities, report has received less attention in recent years
- Adopted streamlined approach for 2023 report

Transit Development Plans

- Tested new review process for 2023–2028 TDPs
- PSRC reviewed these elements:
 - Plan Consistency
 - Performance Measures
 - Regionally Significant Projects
- PSRC received all six and provided a comment letter to each agency
- Tested integrating transit coordination into TDPs



Lessons Learned



- Better understanding of TDP development timelines & processes
- Initial review has helped us identify opportunities to streamline for both parties
- More clear direction & purpose behind transit integration
- Over time, more efficient process for collecting TAM & Safety data
- Learned how to make plan consistency more meaningful after testing initial approach



Proposal for 2024

- PSRC to provide updated guidance for three elements (Q1 2024)
- Ask transit agencies to share draft plans with PSRC during development (Q2 2024)
- PSRC to review and comment (Q2-Q3 2024)
- WSDOT to generate Transit Integration Report (Q3-Q4 2024)



Next Steps



- PSRC will connect with TDP leads in early 2024 to share draft guidance and co-create a timeline
- TDP leads can contact PSRC with any questions during plan development and to share draft
- Report outcomes to TOC at end of process
