Priority Ranking Process for PSRC Region

PSRC provides regional priority rankings to the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) for specialized transportation projects seeking Consolidated Grant funds in King, Pierce, and Snohomish.

PSRC Regional Priority Ranking Process

Sponsors address **both WSDOT's evaluation criteria** and **PSRC's regional priority factors** within the same application.



PSRC staff review applications using regional priority ranking factors for how they address the regional priority ranking factors.



Project **sponsors present their projects** and answer questions from PSRC and members of the committee.



PSRC shares the result with SNTC before the deliberations.



SNTC recommends priority rankings to PSRC committee and boards and Executive Board makes final decision.



PSRC Regional Priority Ranking Factors

- PSRC's regional priority ranking factors are designed to help implement the region's Coordinated Mobility Plan.
- In 2022, PSRC used four priority ranking factors for application review:
 - Project Type (Preservation vs. New or Expansion)
 - Support for Coordinated Mobility Plan
 - Uniqueness of Service
 - Financial Sustainability
- Projects receive a "Yes" or "No" answer for each factor.

PSRC Regional Priority Ranking Factors (Cont'd)

#1. Project Type (Preservation vs. New or Expansion)

Preservation and capital projects that support <u>existing programs at existing</u> <u>service levels</u> receive a "Yes."

#2. Support for PSRC's Coordinated Mobility Plan

Projects adequately address at least one "Emerging Needs and Gaps" <u>as well as</u> at least one "High Prioritized Strategy" receive a "Yes."

#3. Uniqueness of Service

Applicants adequately explain the uniqueness of their programs AND how their projects <u>do not duplicate</u> others for <u>similar target populations within</u> the same geographic area receive a "Yes."

#4. Financial Sustainability

Projects providing more than the <u>federal minimum required match</u> (operating: 50%, capital/mobility management: 20%) from local sources receive a "Yes."

Additional Factors for Considerations

- Geographical distribution of regional priority rankings
- Project types (operation, capital, mobility management)
- Agency equity (# of projects submitted by agency)
- Compelling cases for agencies with limited resources
- Strategic Application of Federal/State Funds
- Coordination
- Acknowledge Importance of the Largest County Service Providers
 (safety net projects)
