
En-Action-2 Watershed Planning Support (Regional Action):

- Provide recreation
- Treat, store, and infiltrate stormwater from hundreds of acres
- Address equity when built areas
 underserved by parks
- Support Tribal treaty rights
- Add natural features and wildlife habitat to an already built park
- Be funded by multiple sources




