Protecting and improving water quality, hydrology and habitat

- RGS-Action-7: Implement the Regional Growth Strategy
- MPP-T-32 and En-18: Retrofit for stormwater treatment and fish passage
- MPP-En-10: Support stewardship
- MPP-En-11 and 12: Conserve open space
- MPP-En-13 and 16: Enhance habitat and tree canopy
- MPP-En-19: Reduce use of toxic products
- MPP-En-20: Restore shorelines and estuaries
- En-Action-3: Watershed planning



VISION 2050 Coordination Action to Support Puget Sound Recovery

En-Action-2 Watershed Planning Support
(Regional Action):

PSRC and the Puget Sound Partnership will coordinate to support watershed planning to inform land use, transportation, and stormwater planning and projects that improve the health of Puget Sound.



Stormwater Parks

Stormwater parks can have multiple benefits:

- Provide recreation
- Treat, store, and infiltrate stormwater from hundreds of acres
- Address equity when built areas underserved by parks
- Support Tribal treaty rights
- Add natural features and wildlife habitat to an already built park
- Be funded by multiple sources

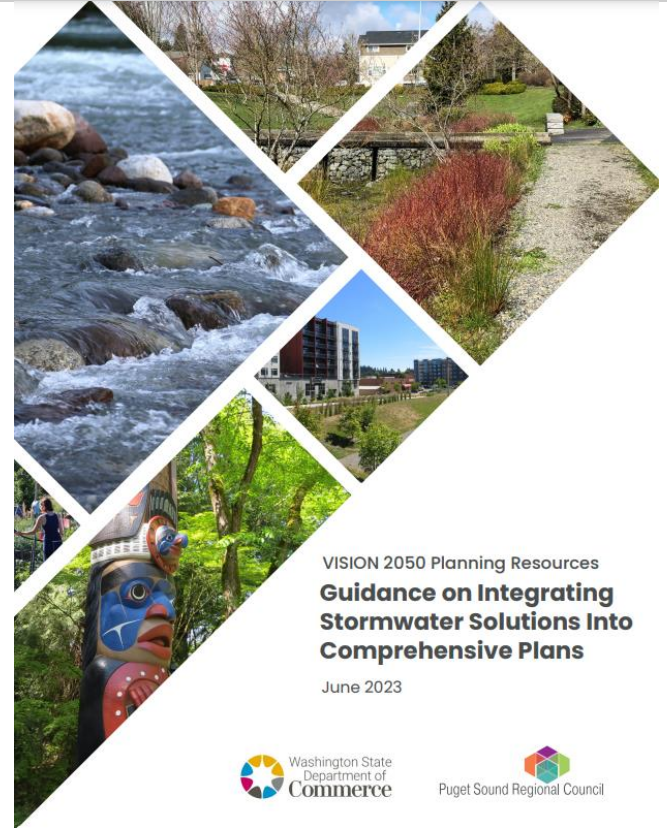
