

#### Supplemental Transportation Budget

- \$14.6b overall
  - \$8.2b capital/\$6.4b operating
- \$1b more than 2023 enacted budget from:
  - \$334m Climate Commitment Act
  - \$900m reappropriations
- Traditional revenue down \$56m

#### **Project Increases**

- \$52m SR 520 Corridor Improvements - West End/Portage Bay
- **\$21m** SR 167
- \$253m I-405/Brickyard, also delays 3 projects 2-10 years

#### Joint Transportation Committee

- \$450k alternative project delivery methods & innovative practices
- \$375k with MSRC work group on local project streamlining and delivery methods



### Washington State Ferries



- Funds 5 new vessels and 3 conversions
- \$15.2m for Workforce Development
- Passenger Only Routes Bremerton (\$4m) and Vashon (\$3.17m)
- \$33m Preservation

#### Studies & Work Groups:

- \$100k work group on funding
- \$140k economic impact study
- \$500k passenger only ferry study
- \$1.5m pre-design study of next class of ferry vessels

## Other Transportation Budget Increases

- \$31m Safety
- \$100m preservation
- \$150m fish passage barrier removal
- \$35.5m port electrification
- \$41m for zero emission vehicle and infrastructure
- \$22m active transportation
- \$15.7m electric school buses
- \$5m Tribal boat electrification




## Road Usage Charge

- \$250k for the Transportation Commission to carry out engagement with stakeholders on results of Forward Drive research program to inform next steps on road usage charging
- Report due 12/1/24

HB 2160 (Reed) dead / SB 6024 dead (Trudeau)

## Promoting community and transitoriented housing development

- 3.5 FAR ½ mile of light, commuter or other rail
- 2.5 FAR ¼ mile of BRT
- Allows substantially similar compliance
- 10% affordable housing requirement
- Allows delay in areas at risk of displacement

## **TOD Budget Proviso - Study**

- \$250k to contract with a national expert to complete review of TOD conditions
- Cities in King, Pierce, Snohomish, Clark and Spokane Counties populations >12,500
- With at least one major transit stop as defined in RCW 36.70A.030
