#### **Comprehensive Plans – Basics**

- Plans updated every 10 years, next due Dec 31, 2024
- Plan elements include background, data and analysis, forward-looking goals and policies
- Public participation required under the Growth Management Act
- State may provide comments but doesn't formally approve plans



# **PSRC & Plan Certification**

#### **Regional Collaboration**

- Challenges such as housing affordability, congestion, and racial disparities require regional coordination
- Supports local jurisdictions to address regional issues

#### **Requirements in State Law**


 Certification ensures state requirements for transportation planning are being met


#### **Transportation Funding**

 Certification is required for jurisdictions to be eligible for PSRC's federal transportation funding





- Rezones/upzones to accommodate housing need



#### **Certification Process**



PSRC Plan Review & Certification Recommendation City of Everett Comprehensive Plan Page 1 of 8

- PSRC staff make recommendations on certification to PSRC Boards
- Executive Board certifies the transportation-related provisions of comprehensive plans conform to the Growth Management Act and consistent with VISION 2050 and the Regional Transportation Plan
- Certification completed by
   September 2025 for fall funding
   competitions



# **Possible Certification Outcomes**

Certification	Conditional Certification	Not certified
<ul> <li>Fully consistent with VISION 2050, the Regional Transportation Plan, and state law requirements</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Meets majority of planning requirements</li> <li>Requires limited additional work for full conformity</li> <li>Still eligible for regional funding, provided conditions of approval are followed</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Inconsistent with VISION 2050, Regional Transportation Plan, or state law requirements</li> <li>Did not submit for certification review</li> </ul>

PSRC's Executive Board is the final decision-making body for plan certification.
