

Freight Advisory Committee Meeting Summary

Date: June 12, 2024, 9:30a.m. – 11:00a.m. Location: Remote – Online Meeting Only (Zoom Meeting)

Welcome and Introductions

Geri Poor, Chair, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. Roll call was completed to confirm the members and alternates present.

Action: Approval of Meeting Summary

The April 10, 2024 meeting summary was approved as presented.

Discussion: FAC Membership Restructure

Jennifer Barnes, PSRC, briefed the committee on PSRC's planned update to the committee's membership structure. The primary goals of the update are (1) to streamline the committee and (2) to revise the representation from the outdated industrial subareas to the current Manufacturing Industrial Centers (MICs). The committee's focus would continue to be to provide analysis and technical guidance on freight matters.

The draft membership structure update that was presented reflected previous input provided by the committee. It would keep the current representation for the counties, ports, WSDOT, FMSIB and tribal agencies; the non-voting seats would be reduced from five to four; the remaining seats would represent each of the ten MICs with two exceptions – Ballard-Interbay and Duwamish MICs would be combined into one seat represented by the City of Seattle, and the Frederickson MIC would be represented by Pierce County.

The committee voiced support for adding seats for SeaTac and Auburn as cities that are identified in the PSRC Industrial Lands Analysis as having substantial freight-intensive areas. At the next meeting, PSRC will provide a final membership structure for the committee to review, that has incorporated this input.

Discussion: 2026 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Freight Focus Topics

Jennifer Barnes, PSRC, provided an overview of the timing for the development of the 2026 RTP and the work performed by the committee for the 2022 RTP which focused on (1) Preservation & Maintenance, (2) Truck Parking, and (3) System Integration. The

committee then continued the discussion from the April 10 meeting when they brainstormed topics for the 2026 RTP. PSRC will provide an online survey to prioritize the list of potential "deep dive" freight topics for the committee to focus on in support of the 2026 RTP, which will be discussed further at a future meeting.

Jim Kelly, City of Arlington, announced that \$1 Million of congressional funding was provided for a separated multiuse path on the SR 531 corridor.
