






# Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)

- Integrated multimodal transportation system
- Reasonable financial strategy to fund investments
- Latest available estimates for growth, travel, and economic activity
- Performance measures and targets
- Address federal planning factors



  - Minimize follow-up
- Distributed in October 2023
- Challenges with response rate
  - 61 responses






# Regional TDM Inventory: Respondents

8. In 2022, did your organization implement any TDM activities, as defined at the top of the page and shown here?




Of the **61** respondents, only **32** (52%) indicated they implement TDM.



# Regional TDM Inventory: Partnerships




Of the 32 respondents who indicated they implemented TDM, most target multiple audiences.

#### Resources for Plan Consistency

#### Commute Trip Reduction Plans – Local CTR Plans

Jurisdictions affected by the Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) Law are required to develop a local commute trip reduction plan and update it at least once every four years.

These plans are designed to ensure that CTR program goals and targets help jurisdictions achieve their broader transportation and land use goals, and that the jurisdiction in turn develops services, regulations, policies, and programs that support the trip reduction investments of major employers.

In October 2023 the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) published **guidance** for the next cycle of four-year plans, covering July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2029.



#### Integrating Local Plans into the Regional Plan




- Current Regional Transportation Plan (2022-2050) provides regional priorities to guide local CTR plan consistency.
