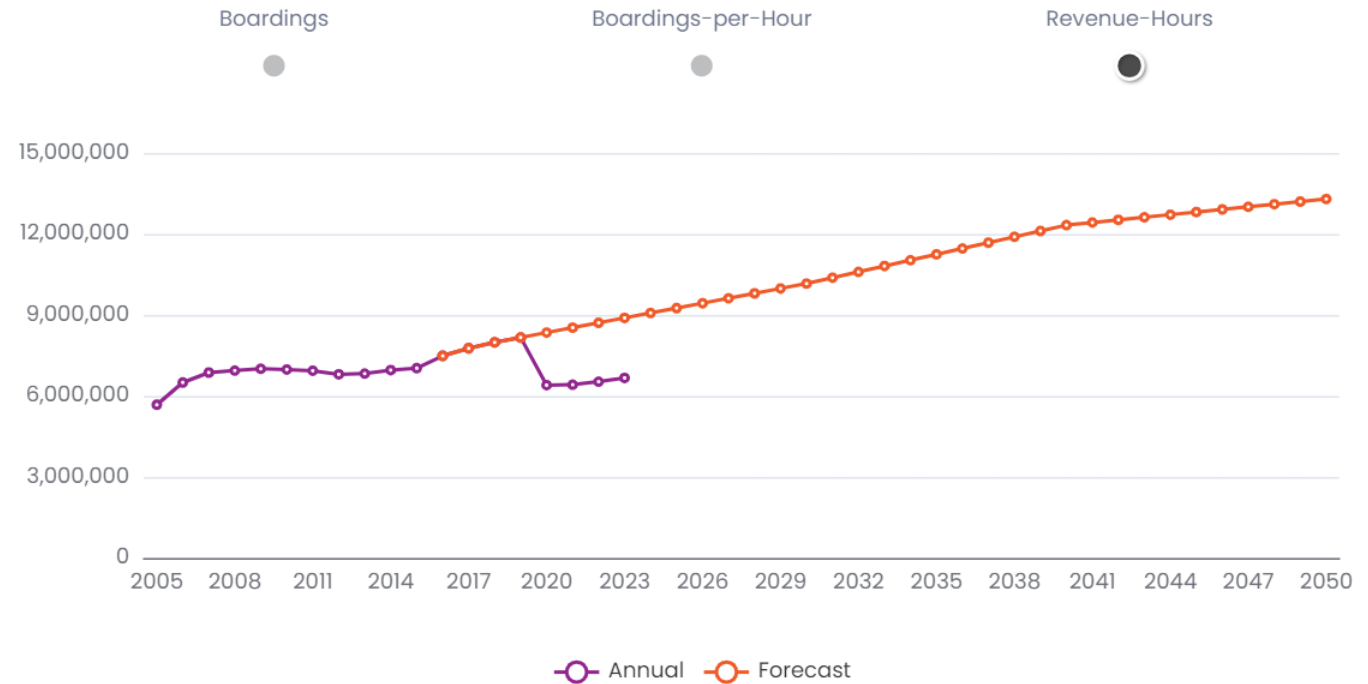

Local Transit Growth Assumptions

The 2022–2050 RTP assumed a **66%** increase in transit service hours between 2018 and 2050

For this **RTP** do we:

- Catch up and grow?
- Grow 2% a year from 2023 levels?
- Grow at some other level?

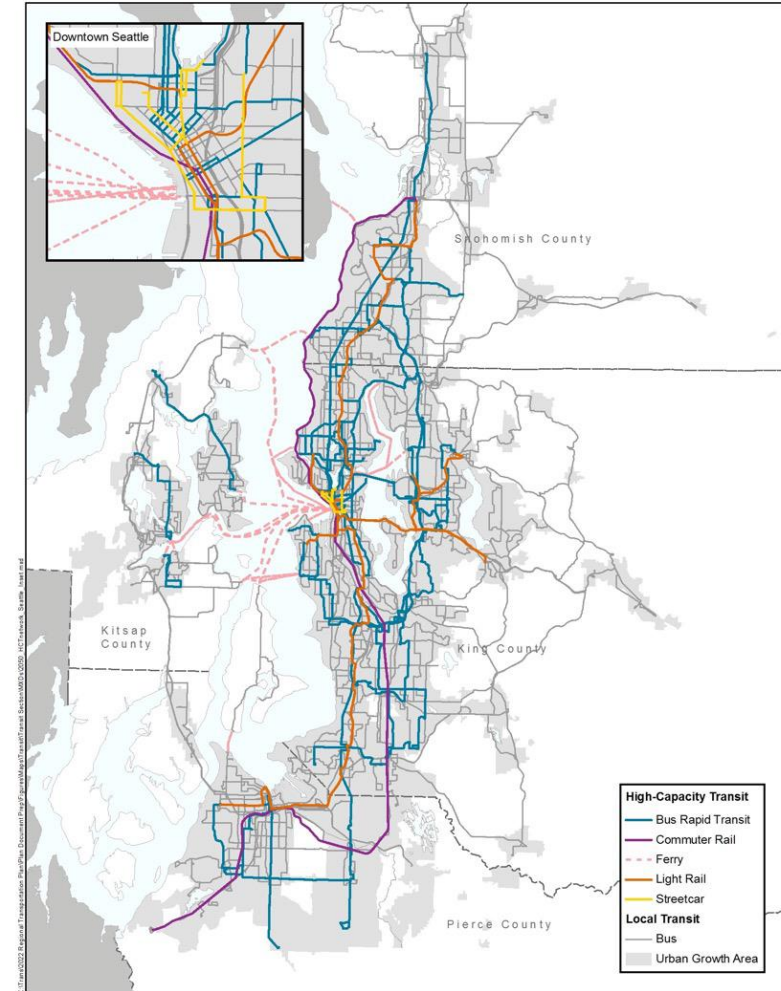


Development of Future Transit Networks

The 2022–2050 RTP future transit networks were provided by Transit agencies in a **gtfs** format for 2030 and 2050.

For this **RTP**:

- What is a meaningful interim year(s)?
- Is the 2050 network any different than the Current plan?



PSRC needs the networks by **April 1, 2025**



Transit Metrics

The 2022–2050 RTP focused on a few key transit metrics: **Boardings, Revenue-Hours & Boardings per Hour** and provided data by transit mode and operator

For this **RTP**:

- Are we missing a metric that is key in your long-range plan?
- Do you have updated annualization factors?



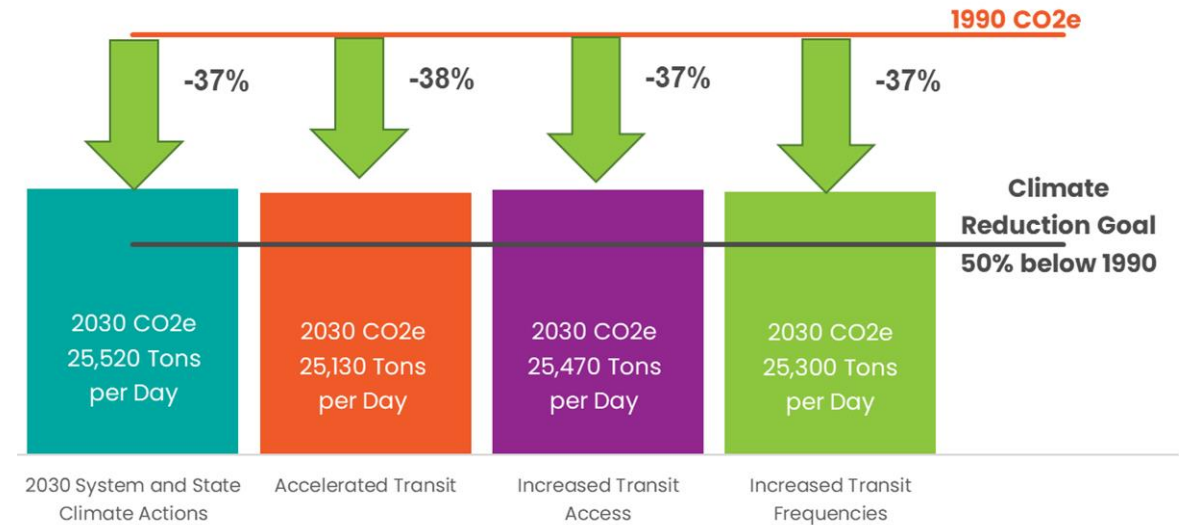
Sensitivity Tests
