


Homage's Transportation Assistance Program TAP Sustain

TAP Sustain will continue to cover the entirety of Snohomish County.






Our Passenger Base

In 2025, almost 25% of the Snohomish county's population will be over 60, that is almost 217,000 people.

The average man and woman will outlive their ability to drive by at least 6 to 11 years respectively. (Snohomish County Human Services, Area Plan Update 2022-2023, p. 13)

Impact

TAP completes:

- 60 120 trips per day, M-F
- on 11 ADA accessible vehicles
- Handled by a team of 18
- Service the areas that others do not

Serving people who are <u>outside</u> of the normal public service corridors.

Taking riders to:

- Medical appointments
- Work
- School
- Groceries
- Social gatherings



Carrying the underserved population

- 1,434 unduplicated clients
- Majority are female at 64%
- Median age: 61 years old
- 817 clients have a disability (57%)
- Very rural residents

Our riders live outside ¾ of a mile from regular bus service. The further a person lives from a major city, the more underserved the population.

Increased Demand

TAP is unique because we are moving people in areas that no other transit agency provides accessible service.

Between July 2023 through June 2024,

TAP traveled over 602,000 revenue miles, and completed over 16,900 trips,

an 18.2% increase over the previous year.



Growth in Rural Areas

This four-year project is to sustain the Transportation Assistance
Program (TAP) by providing demand response service for older adults,
persons with disabilities, and low-income individuals who live outside
the paratransit boundaries.
