Background

Per federal and state requirements, as part of the Regional Transportation Plan PSRC must:

- Identify a regional transportation network, including existing and proposed facilities and operations
- Identify regionally significant additions or modifications to that network

Regionally significant projects – regardless of funding source – will not be approved if the project is not included in a conforming transportation plan



Background

- Further, per agreement with FHWA and FTA, regionally significant projects are submitted into the Regional Transportation Plan as <u>Candidate</u> projects
- Projects must receive <u>Approval</u> prior to implementation
 - Purpose is to ensure that projects as implemented are consistent with the information submitted into the plan and included in the conformity analysis



Background

To comply with these requirements, PSRC has developed a regional transportation network and thresholds to determine if a project is a *Regional Capacity Project*

 Thresholds exist for all modes – roadway, transit, ferries, bicycle/pedestrian, and ITS

In addition, all projects requesting submission into the plan respond to the adopted Plan Consistency Framework questions and are reviewed by the board prior to inclusion

All Planning Studies

Roadway Projects

- Any investment on minor arterials and below (with the exception of State Routes)
- The following work on any facility (including principal arterials and above):
 - · Rehabilitation and maintenance
 - Safety (not impacting capacity or operations)
 - Operations (i.e., management of roadways, weigh stations, rest areas, studies, etc.)
 - New shoulders or changes to shoulder usage
 - Reconstruction of existing interchanges using the same alignment (additional lanes permitted, but not new turning movements)
 - Left turn lanes not continuous, or other intersection improvements

Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Projects

Projects under \$100 Million

Bicycle and/or Pedestrian Projects

- Facilities adjacent to and within roadway rights of way (bike lanes, sidewalks, pedestrian over/under-crossings etc.)
- Projects under \$20 Million on separated pathways on dedicated rights of way

Transit Projects

- New bus routes
- New buses, changes to bus service
- Bus amenities such as shelters, bus stop improvements, etc.
- Transit Maintenance and Operation bases
- Park & ride lots resulting in less than 250 stalls
- Transportation Demand Management (TDM) programs (e.g., ridesharing, vanpooling, commute trip reduction programs)

Ferry Projects

- Changes to existing ferry service
- New ferries on existing routes



Thresholds

The current Bicycle / Pedestrian thresholds were developed under consultation with BPAC in 2016

- Focused on separated rights of way
- Determination not to simply address all trail projects as programmatic
- Determination of cost as the most logical surrogate to capture "large" trail projects
- Still some definitional challenges



Next Steps

- Process currently underway to update the Plan Consistency Framework
- RTP Call for Projects in March 2025
