You can call the Legislative Hotline to leave a message for your state district legislators on issues of concern or on questions about bills or laws. These messages are forwarded electronically to the appropriate district. When leaving a message with the hotline, please be prepared to give your first and last name and street address with zip code. The hotline staff will also fulfill requests for bills and other legislative documents and can answer questions about meeting times and places, and the legislative process.

During the legislative session, the hotline is open from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. When the legislature is not in session the hotline is open from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00p.m. and from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.
