4. Action: TOC Vice-Chair for 2025 (10:15) - Gil Cerise, PSRC

At the December 4, 2024 TOC meeting, PSRC staff asked for volunteers interested in serving as Vice-chair of the committee to complete the term of service started by Melinda Adams (Everett Transit). Alex Krieg (Sound Transit) is the only candidate who has volunteered. PSRC requests action to confirm Alex in this position for the remainder of the 2024-2025 term for committee leadership.

5. Discussion/Action: Local Transit representation on the Regional TOD Committee* (10:20) – Gil Cerise, PSRC

PSRC is seeking renewal of local transit representation on the Regional TOD Committee for 2025-2027.

6. Discussion: Regional Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (10:30) – Kelly McGourty, PSRC

The Puget Sound Clean Air Agency is leading the effort to develop a regional Comprehensive Climate Action Plan under EPA's Climate Pollution Reduction Grant Program. PSRC is a partner on this effort and is spearheading the on-road transportation component. Staff will provide information on the CCAP process and transit-related emission reduction measures that will be included in the plan.

Welcome and Introductions

Peter Heffernan, King County Metro, welcomed everyone at 10:00 a.m. Peter took roll call and confirmed the members and alternates present.

Approval of Meeting Summary

Discussion: PSRC Transit Model Summit

Stefan Coe and Brice Nichols, PSRC, shared information about PSRC's model and how it incorporates transit to identify future transit boardings and other metrics. Brant Lyerla from Sound Transit provided background on Sound Transit's model. Committee members and guests asked the presenters questions. Craig Helmann, PSRC, indicated that PSRC wants to ensure transit agencies understand the two different models since

outputs from each model are reported. In recent years, many other transit agencies' consultant teams have used the Sound Transit model as the basis for their long-range plans. PSRC's travel model is used for more comprehensive travel forecasting, not just for transit.

SUBJECT: Local Transit Representation on the Regional TOD Committee

IN BRIEF

The three-year term for local transit representation on PSRC's Regional TOD Committee has ended. PSRC will seek TOC's nominations for two representatives to serve on the Regional TOD Committee for the 2025-2027 term.

DISCUSSION

The Regional TOD Committee adopted charter includes a provision for the TOC to appoint two members to represent local transit on that committee. Sound Transit and WSDOT have dedicated membership seats on the Regional TOD Committee. In addition, PSRC member cities and counties also have an opportunity to apply for representation on the RTOD Committee. The full membership composition of the Regional TOD Committee can be found on the committee's charter.

Existing local transit representatives on the Regional TOD Committee include:

- 1. Sarah Lovell (member) and Chris Arkills (alternate) for King County Metro, and
- 2. Mark Eldridge for Pierce Transit (no alternate). Lindsey Sehmel was originally appointed to represent Pierce Transit. Pierce Transit appointed Mark to replace Lindsey left that agency.

Local transit agency representatives do not have to be TOC members. If there is staff turnover, Regional TOD Committee staff ask the transit agency appointed to serve for that term to replace the member who has vacated the membership seat.

NEXT STEPS

PSRC staff will ask TOC to nominate staff from local transit agencies to serve on the Regional TOD Committee. If more than two agencies request to serve, PSRC will arrange a vote-by-email to identify the agencies providing representation for 2025-2027.

PSRC will need names for the committee in February for the March 2025 Regional TOD Committee meeting.
