RTP Financial Strategy – M&P Component

- The Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) financial strategy includes an estimate of the cost to maintain, operate, and improve the transportation network through 2050
- A significant portion of these costs are maintenance and preservation (M&P) for the transportation network
- The local agency component of the M&P estimate includes pavement, traffic control devices, bridges, culverts, sidewalks, and other transportation assets
- Online surveys will be used to collect data from local agencies on pavement and traffic control devices will be released in early February, due in mid-March



RTP Pavement Survey

- Survey includes questions about
 - Total lane mileage
 - Current pavement condition
 - Cost to maintain current condition
 - Cost to achieve and maintain citywide PCI average of 70
- General notes
 - High-level, long-range planning estimates
 - Data is combined and analyzed in the aggregate
- Changes from 2022
 - Some questions removed and ambiguity addressed with additional guidance



RTP Traffic Control Devices (ITS) Survey

- Survey includes questions about
 - Actual costs related to capital preservation, maintenance and operations of Traffic Control Devices
 - Projected costs for optimal capital preservation, maintenance and operations of Traffic Control Devices
- General Notes
 - High-level, long-range planning estimates
 - Data is combined and analyzed in the aggregate
- No changes from 2022
