- Scope addresses major board priorities, including:
 - Equity
 - Safety: [Regional Safety Action Plan](#)
 - Climate: [Comprehensive Climate Action Plans](#)
 - Transit services and access
 - Maintenance and preservation



Upcoming Board and Plan Milestones

January–April: review of existing transportation system, identification of needs and gaps

- *Publication of “State of the System” report*

March:

- Safety & transportation public opinion survey
- Outreach on mobility needs for Coordinated Mobility Plan
- Call for regional capacity projects



Upcoming Board and Plan Milestones

May-June: review of proposed new investments, future needs
(programmatic and regional capacity)

July-August: analysis of draft alternatives

September-December: development of draft plan

Public engagement planned throughout 2025

*Board discussions will include how the **Regional Safety Action Plan** and **Comprehensive Climate Action Plan** will inform the RTP*



Proposed RPEC Focus Topics

Proposed topics for future RPEC discussions:

- Integrating Regional Safety Action Plan in the RTP
- Identification of system needs
- Syncing financial strategy with investments



Comprehensive Climate Action Plan

- Led by Puget Sound Clean Air Agency
 - In partnership with state, PSRC, counties, major cities
- Due December 2025
- Must identify measures across all sectors to meet the regional climate goals
- PSRC leading on-road transportation
 - Measures will be shared for feedback
- Future board conversation on how CCAP informs the RTP
