### **Freight Advisory Committee Meeting Summary**

**Date: December 11, 2024, 9:30a.m. – 11:00a.m.**

**Location: Remote – Online Meeting Only (Zoom Meeting)**

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#### **Welcome and Introductions**

Doug Cox, PSRC, welcomed everyone at 9:30 a.m. Roll call was completed to confirm the members and alternates present.

#### **Action: Approval of Meeting Summary**

The October 9, 2024 meeting summary was approved as presented.

#### **Discussion: Truck Parking Implementation Plan**

Fred Wenhardt, FMSIB, and Jason Beloso, WSDOT, presented highlights and goals of the Washington State Truck Parking Implementation Plan. Presenters shared key truck parking recommendations and actions that WSDOT and FMSIB will follow. The truck parking recommendation framework focuses on parking capacity preservation, expansion, and information management improvements. All six recommendations are projected to be funded by 2030. Committee members discussed the distribution of private and public truck parking in the region.

#### **Discussion: Regional Safety Action Plan Development**

Gary Simonson, PSRC, provided the committee with updates of the Regional Safety Action Plan. The presentation included key findings from WSDOT crash data analysis, preliminary strategies developed for the safety plan, and a summary of feedback from the engagement process thus far. The public is most concerned about speeding and other unsafe driving behaviors (reckless, distracted, impaired, etc.) Local agencies are most concerned about lack of funding for safety improvements and have emphasized the benefit of sharing safety data across the Region. The plan will focus on the Safe System Approach with strategies that local jurisdictions can apply depending on local needs. The plan includes reference tables with strategies for each common crash type for local jurisdictions to utilize. The draft Regional Action Safety Plan will be released for public comment the week January 13th, 2025.

### **Discussion: 2025 FGTS Data Collection**

Wenjuan Zhao, WSDOT, and Doug Cox, PSRC, notified the committee of the upcoming 2025 Freight and Goods Transportation System (FGTS) data collection effort. The FGTS is used to classify the multimodal freight corridors in Washington based on the freight tonnage transported along these corridors. WSDOT updates this classification every two years. WSDOT is requesting classification data for T-1 through T-5 corridors and truck volume data from cities and ports in King, Pierce, and Snohomish counties. Truck volume data must be from June 2021 or more recent for a corridor to be designated as T-1 or T-2. WSDOT will ask MPOs to collect FGTS data from cities and ports from February-May 2025. MPOs will submit consolidated FGTS data from their region to WSDOT by June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2025.
