

Swift Orange Line Station Project - Regional FTA 5307 Competition

Community Transit is building a network of Swift Bus Rapid Transit service in Snohomish County. Community Transit is requesting \$5 million dollars to construct twenty-six (26) stations along the Swift Orange Line alignment. The Swift BRT Orange Line will connect to east/west corridors 164th Street and 196th Street, serving the Lynnwood Regional Growth Center, Ash Way Urban Center and the Mill Creek Town Center.

Benefits:

- ❖ Swift Orange Line meets the need for high capacity transit service in areas with high employment and residential density, all day high frequency service opens up a new travel market in S. Snohomish County.
- ❖ Serves Lynnwood Regional Growth Center and locally designated Ash Way Urban Center and Mill Creek Town Center.
- ❖ Connects to Swift Green Line scheduled to be complete in 2019.
- ❖ Provide East-West mobility options to feed Sound Transit's Link Light Rail in 2024
- ❖ Reduces delay on the 164th corridor currently designated by Snohomish County at ultimate capacity.
- ❖ Assists local and regional land use and development goals that identify the need for high capacity transit service in the project area.

Project Status:

Community Transit completed the feasibility phase of the Swift BRT Orange Line in March 2018. A preferred alignment has been chosen, potential station locations identified, ridership forecasts complete and chokepoints and transit priority treatments identified.

Project Development September 2018 – December 2020

(Design, engineer and environmental determination/approval)

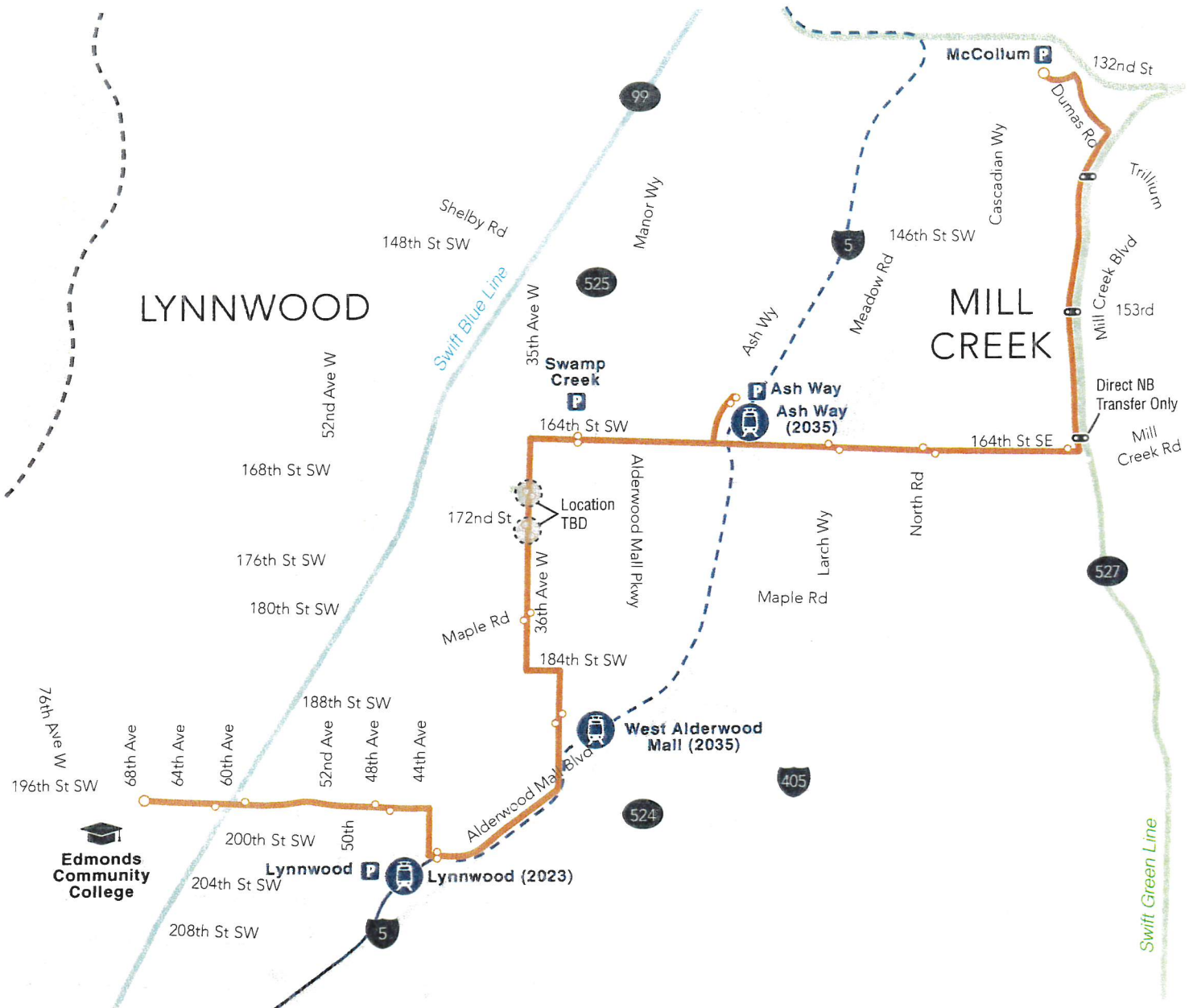
Station Construction January 2021 – December 2023
